## INTRODUCTION TO “The New Testament Challenge!”

“The New Testament Challenge!” Are you up to it?

Have you ever read the entire New Testament? Do you know what it actually says or have you been told by someone else? Do you know the major players, the central themes or the key issues? Do you know where in the New Testament to turn to read about Jesus, the church, or Christ’s second coming? Wouldn’t you like to know what it really says? Are you up to the challenge to read it for yourself?

Perhaps you have read it cover to cover. Maybe you have studied it in depth. How long has it been since you’ve simply read it from beginning to end? Are you ready for a fresh look?

“The New Testament Challenge!” is an opportunity to read the entire New Testament in twelve weeks. Twenty seven small books including four gospels written by eight authors all pointing to one person. The reading schedule is organized into six days of reading per week. This journal provides the opportunity to jot down some of your ideas as you read.

You may be surprised by pragmatic and relevant teachings, covering topics such as relationships, marriage, money management, children, community living, caring for the poor, racial prejudice, dealing with grief, etc. Of course, a myriad of spiritual issues are also included such as angels, prayer, worship, prophecy, the incarnation, Christ’s return, Church policy, the Holy Spirit, and most importantly, eternal life!

One word of caution: it is not possible to embark on this challenge without it impacting your life (not to mention your eternal destiny). Are you up to the challenge?!

## MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ROD

The Bible is unlike any book you have ever read. Few have walked away from its pages unchanged, even thousands of years after it was penned. While some would say that the Bible is not relevant for our current generation; I have found just the opposite to be true. In fact, I have found the New Testament to be remarkably up to date and relevant for the days we live in.

Like its author, the Bible is not static; rather, it is a book that has an uncanny ability to speak right to your heart in a fresh and vibrant way, even though you may have read it many times before. (Some who read the Bible for the first time comment that they almost feel like the Bible is reading them! Truly, a remarkable Book of Books)

Many read the Bible in just a few verses, or maybe chapters, at a time. The purpose of this journal is to help you with the discipline of a fuller daily reading schedule, as well as a place for you to make notes and comments. This journal can be used in many different ways: personal devotions, husband & wife devotions, family devotions, small group Bible study, etc. The journal is simply a tool to help you find success and I encourage you to use it in the way that works best for you.

Along these lines, many find it quite helpful to have a set routine to do their daily Bible reading and journaling. Those who find success in completing the challenge typically do their reading at the same time and in the same place each day. It is always best to get away from distractions like the television, computer, phone, etc.

It is my prayer that as you engage in "The New Testament Challenge!" reading and journaling, the Holy Spirit will touch your heart and draw you into a deeper and more consistent daily walk with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.
